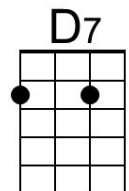
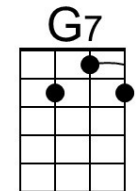
## Intro

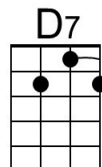
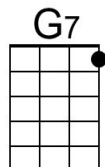
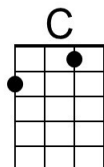
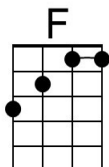


**Outro:** Repeat last line; end with **G7 – C**.
